


Studying God's Word together is important! Wednesday

Thursday, April 8, 2004 12:05 p.m.

Mom.

Things are busy here. We are losing guys every day, but the enemy is losing more.

This war has galvanized my faith in GOD and I no longer have doubt. We are in the fight of our generation, and like the generations before us, we have risen to the challenge. I am comfortable with my fate whatever it may be. I have spoken to Jamie in detail about my wishes if I should be killed, but I want you to know this: I have loved your daughter for almost my entire life and I will always love her. She and that beautiful little girl of ours made me a better man and the man I am today. They are the reason I fight. You and Dad accepted me for all my faults, and understood that underneath it all, I truly loved your daughter. You two became the parents I never really had, caring and forgiving. Through you I came to understand what family was and is. Through your example I also understand that GOD really is the

centerpiece of our lives, and with His help and guidance through faith, we will prevail.

This war we fight is just. Our Commander in Chief was correct in his decision, and I gladly support it. The world we leave behind for those beautiful grandchildren of yours will be a safer place because of this event.

I am writing this because I know first-hand how fleeting life is and how quickly death can come. If anything should happen to me, know that Jamie and Kayla were my light, GOD is my anchor, and you made me feel like a son.
