



We're back in school! And that means students have gathered all their school supplies for the

new academic year. In our country, basic school supplies are inexpensive and readily available, but in Liberia school supplies are hard to come by - a luxury that is treasured and used carefully. Trinity will once again support missionary Joe Boway in his work of sharing the Good News of Jesus along with a good education to children in Africa. Joe began this ministry with one school in Liberia, a country where children would have had little opportunity to learn to read, much less learn about Jesus. Liberian Children's Ministry now operates Lutheran schools serving over 3,000 Liberian children.

Trinity is collecting the following school supplies for Liberian Children's Ministry between now and October 4.

- Pencils
- Spiral bound notebooks
- new or gently used backpacks
- monetary gifts to help cover shipping costs (checks payable to Trinity Lutheran Church or enveloped cash should be clearly labeled LIBERIAN CHILDREN'S MINISTRY and place in offering plate or delivered to Trinity's office please submit by Oct 1.

Donated supplies may be placed in marked boxes located in the church parish hall and school entryway.



Stewardship: Not Just About Money


If we look at the Bible's Old Testament examples of faithful stewards, we see how...

- Noah was called to steward the animals and his family to preserve them in the Great Flood.
- Abraham was a steward of the promise to create a great nation of a wandering people, who would become God's people - Israel.
- Moses faithfully stewarded the children of Israel, leading them out of Egyptian bondage, through forty years wandering the wilderness, to God's promised land.
- Ezra served as a steward to the people of Jerusalem, teaching them God's law after their return from 70 years of captivity in Babylonian.
- Joseph was a steward in Potiphar's household, as a leader in prison, and under Pharaoh caring for the needs of the Egyptians and his family.

And in the New Testament, we observe the disciples serving as faithful stewards teaching the Word of God and spreading the gospel throughout the world.

So when it comes to being a good steward not only do we want to dedicate our money to increase God's kingdom, but our time, efforts, skills, and intentions. Ask yourself, "How might I be a steward of God's creation or His people?" From these ancient people of faith we can learn how to answer when God places that task before you.

One family has been meeting in Indiana, holding a reunion in the Hoosier State for more than 120 years.

There are many ways in which the Lord blesses the lives of those who trust in Him. This family acknowledged that God has been with them from good health, and a steady source of income to His daily protection and

Guidance. They all agree that God has shown his love, mercy and goodness, through rough times and good times. "Through sickness and healing, God has been there in the journey with us." They want others to know that He will be there for them, too.

The senior male member of the family said that one of the biggest ways the Lord blesses believers, is through the gift of family. The Beck family is well aware of the importance of family, which is why they have held an annual reunion every year since 1899.

The longstanding tradition was first established in 1899 in early July. The gathering began moving around and was held at different Beck family households. Eventually, around 1925, the reunion moved to Province Park in Franklin, Indiana. It has been there ever since. The family held their most recent reunion on July 2, 2023.

They said that their faith in God has kept them together. This has been their lifelong witness to His mercies.
