





¹⁹By this we shall know that we are of the truth and reassure our heart before him;


²⁰ for whenever our heart condemns us, God is greater than our heart, and he knows

P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the tenth chapter.








P Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


