

4. Mrs. Solyom has to have SOMETHING to do on a Sunday morning!


3. It will be more convenient for you to attend adult Bible class during Trinity's Bible Hour.




Young Women and Young-Womenat-Heart Winter Retreat

Ingredients:

schedule.

1.large egg 1/2 teaspoon salt ¹/₂ teaspoon ground black pepper 1 pound ground beef $\frac{1}{2}$ cup fine dry bread crumbs

Directions

Can be cooked on an inside griddle or an outside griddle on a grill.

Whisk together egg, salt, and pepper in a medium bowl.

Add ground beef and bread crumbs and mix with your hands or a fork until well blended.

Form into four 3/4-inch-thick patties.

Place patties on the preheated grill. Cover and cook 6 to 8 minutes per side, or to desired doneness. An instant-read thermometer inserted into the center should read at least 160 degrees F (70 degrees C).

Serve hot and enjoy!

Celebrating the Epíphany in the Bible

Evangelism

The Gospel reading on the Epiphany, which tells the story of the three wise men arriving in Bethlehem to find Jesus, comes from Matthew, Chapter 2:

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews?

We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel."

Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage."



After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the

child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their

treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.


If you grew up in a household that kept its Christmas tree up until January 6th, you're probably familiar with Epiphany.
